



With fewer people coming on Sunday mornings to worship in person, it has been imperative that we **move outside the building and into their homes**. I'm reminded of a sign I once saw in a church that said, "The Church has left the Building." My wife, Anita, and I host a **Life Group in our home** and one of the passions we have shared with them is from James 1:27 "Pure religion is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress..." One week after reading that verse, I literally crumpled up my notes, turned to the group, and said, "Ok, how are we going to do this?" After brainstorming together, we had come up with a plan to reach out.

We focused on widows and widowers. It seems many of them are home alone especially during COVID and the winter months. They enjoy seeing and chatting with other people. And of course, they need to eat! So, we put together a **Christmas Dinner** near Christmas for them. We made postcards and hand delivered them. We offered them a ride to and from the dinner. We offered to take a meal to them if they couldn't come. We played Bingo and the prizes were coupons for things like "a hot meal," "help with tech," "transportation," and "cleaning." We pray moving into 2022 our group can continue to look after "orphans and widows."

If you don't see me in church on Sunday morning, it is probably because I am up in the sound booth making the magic happen with our **KCC Sunday Livestream**. We livestream to three platforms every Sunday morning, Facebook, YouTube, and Church Online Platform.

Besides our YouTube and Facebook page, I also maintain our website (kccwired.com), a Twitter account, an Instagram account, and many Facebook Groups. Anytime you want to find us, **search for "KCCWIRED**."

My wife, **Anita, is my life and love**. She partners with me in ministry every hour of every day. She leads a women's weekly Bible study called Bible Study Fellowship (BSF) at KCC. She hosts Life Group with me in our home. And she serves on the Worship Team playing the piano on Sundays. She does so much more that goes unnoticed.

2021 marked the **20th year our family has been serving here in Kalkaska**. 
WOW! That pretty much sums up my first quarter here at KCC.




Circulation in the library has definitely increased since the congregation has been able to return to church. We are looking forward to continued library use for all ages in 2022.

Men's Ministry

The Men's Ministry functions around two programs and two events. The first program is the Men's Prayer Breakfast held every fifth Sunday, which works out to be once per quarter. During that time, we have an awesome breakfast, a short devotion and then end with guys praying at their tables. With the uncertainty of COVID, we weren't sure how many breakfasts we could have or who would come. As we have observed with many things, guys wanted to get back together and so we did. We had four successful breakfasts with a good turnout each time. This year the breakfasts will be on January 30th, May 29th, July 31st, and October 30th. The larger focus of this event is to encourage guys to pray for the ministry staff, of which, the staff is eternally grateful for the prayers.

The second program is Basecamp. Basecamp was developed as a discipleship program for men. We meet on the fourth Tuesday of the month, have dinner, watch a video teaching, do a physical or fun activity, and then break into small groups. We had 70 men sign up, which was bigger than the first year we launched it. COVID shut us down one month, however, most of the small groups got together that week anyway. Again, men are hungry for discipleship and meeting together.

The first event we have each year is the men and boys skeet shoot out at Wilderness Christian Assembly. Our numbers were lower this year, but we had a great breakfast to kick things off (do you notice the theme of men meeting and food?), and then headed to the camp. We had several first-timers join us and then a few seasoned regulars.



The second event we usually have is the men and boys river float. That event was canceled this year. Our numbers for that event had dwindled over the past few years and we are re-assessing whether or not to go forward with it.

We will continue driving forward as we seek to disciple men and make them disciplemakers.

Our mission in 2021 that will continue in 2022 is based on meeting the physical and mental needs of our ladies through connection and surrounding them with the love of our heavenly Father. As we have been so unselfishly loved by Jesus, may we show that same love to those by giving of ourselves, whether it's a meal, our time, or our resources. As we enter into what seems like a new normal, we are adjusting some of the ways we meet but we are praising God for His guidance and protection as we move forward spreading His love.

Our first big function for 2021 was the IF Conference that we held in April. We had approximately 80 ladies attend and we walked away inspired to never lose hope, **EVEN IF** the worst happens; that there is a God who has a plan for the **EVEN IF** and a God that has a plan for us in the midst of the chaos.

In September, Titus 2 started back up and currently there are approximately 120 ladies working through the study "The Good Gospel", understanding the greatest news we've ever heard. As we build new relationships and spend time in community lifting each other up, our cups are being filled and we are applying His truths to our lives! Bible Study Fellowship was also started in September and this year they are diving into the book of Matthew; digging deep while learning to read, review, reflect and respond to God's word and His teaching for our lives.

October brought "Meet S'more Sisters" night. 37 ladies gathered to meet for an evening of fellowship, food and fun. It was a fun night of getting to know some new faces and also growing closer as a community of Sisters in Christ.

In December, the Christmas Tea was full of "Squeezing Joy into the Christmas Season" with over 240 ladies in attendance. There were amazing table decors, wonderful food, beautiful music and lots of laughter filling the room. We were entertained by the comedian, Kristin Weber, who brought lots of joy to our hearts and gave us renewed spirits as we entered into the beautiful Christmas season.

This year we implemented a new avenue of reaching out to our younger families by starting the Baby Blessing Basket and Dinner Trains for all the new babies and their families in our church! I think someone is praying for babies again because we have blessed eight families since September. What a sweet, sweet thing God is doing in our church family!

In 2022, we hope to continue all of the above and add some outreach events while we continue to focus on filling the cups of our sisters in Christ with His extravagant love! The women's ministry is completely blessed by some amazing organizers, volunteering their time and using their God given gifts to bless those around us. I can't thank you all enough for your driving forces and I truly look forward to seeing what God has in store for 2022!

Operation Christmas Child


